Submission of Abstracts and Conference Volume

1. Abstracts Submission and Form

Abstract for conference presentation should be submitted via email (in either .doc, .rtf or pdf form) to Prof Darrel Maddy (darrel.maddy@ncl.ac.uk) by **JUNE 30th** at the latest.

Abstracts should be no longer than 400 words. The abstract should be supplied using 12 point Arial Font throughout, and should be double spaced with margins no less than 2cm all round. Please supply the abstract in the following form:

Abstract (not to exceed 400 words)

The abstract may include diagrams but must not exceed 1 side of A4 paper.

Please indicate whether you wish to offer the contributions as an oral presentation or a poster presentation. Please note that all abstracts will be passed to the Session organisers. We cannot guarantee that all oral presentations offered will be accepted given the limited timescale of the conference and therefore you may be allocated a poster slot. No abstract will appear in the conference abstract volume without at least one author being registered and the work being presented at the conference.

No author should request more than one oral presentation.

Instructions to Authors of submitted papers

DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS IS END SEPTEMBER 2006

A number of papers from the FLAG2006 conference will be published as a Special Issue of Journal of Quaternary Science. It is hoped that this issue will appear before the end of 2007. We would therefore warn all potential authors that we will only in exceptional circumstances be able to accept late submissions.

We will accept contributions presenting the results of research into any aspect of fluvial archives and Quaternary Science. Manuscripts should not normally exceed **7000** words.

Initial submission: Three paper copies of the manuscript, diagrams and tables should be sent to:

Authors should retain an identical copy of the manuscript. **All Manuscripts should be in English.**

Final submission file types. Preferred formats for the text and tables of your accepted manuscript are .doc and .rtf. files provided that an .eps or .pdf file is provided **in addition** to the source files. Figures may be provided in .tiff or .eps format.

Manuscript style. The language of the journal is English. All submissions must have a title, be printed on one side of the paper, be double-line spaced and have a margin of 3cm all round. Illustrations and tables must be printed on separate sheets, and not be incorporated into the text.

- The **title page** must list the full title, a short title of up to 70 characters and names and affiliations of all authors. Give the full address, including e-mail, telephone and fax, of the author who is to check the proofs.
- Include the name(s) of any **sponsor(s)** of the research contained in the paper, along with **grant number(s)**.
- Supply an **abstract** of up to 200 words for all articles. An abstract is a concise summary of the whole paper, not just the conclusions, and is understandable without reference to the rest of the paper. It should contain no citation to other published work.
- Include up to five **keywords** that describe your paper for indexing purposes.

Reference style. References should be quoted in the text as name and year within brackets and listed at the end of the paper alphabetically. Where reference is made to more than one work by the same author published in the same year, identify each citation in the text as follows: (Collins, 1998a), (Collins, 1998b). Where three or more authors are listed in the reference list, please cite in the text as (Collins *et al.*, 1998)

All references must be complete and accurate. Where possible the [DOI](#) for the reference should be included at the end of the reference. Online citations should include date of access. If necessary, cite unpublished or personal work in the text but do not include it in the reference list. References should be listed in the following style:

Illustrations. Supply each illustration as a separate file with the lead author's name and the figure number, with the top of the figure indicated. Use an external light source when photographing soil profiles to ensure that fine detail will be shown in the printed version. Grey shading and thin lines are NOT ACCEPTABLE. Please use hatching, dotting etc. to define specified areas. Lettering must be of a reasonable size that would still be clearly legible upon reduction, and consistent within each figure and set of figures. Supply artwork at the intended size for printing.

All illustrations must be supplied at the correct resolution:

- Black and white and colour photos - 300 dpi
- Graphs, drawings, etc - 800 dpi preferred; 600 dpi minimum
- Combinations of photos and drawings (black and white and colour) - 500 dpi

Electronic artwork. If colour illustrations are supplied electronically in either **TIFF** or **EPS** format, they **may** be used in the PDF of the article at no cost to the author, even if this illustration was printed in black and white in the journal. The PDF will appear on the [Wiley InterScience](#) site. The cost of printing **colour** illustrations may be charged to the author although a limited number of colour illustrations are available each year.

Copyright. To enable the publisher to disseminate the author's work to the fullest extent, the author must sign a [Copyright Transfer Agreement](#), transferring copyright in the article from the author to the publisher, and submit the original signed agreement with the article presented for publication. A copy of the agreement to be used (which may be photocopied) can be found in each volume of *Journal of Quaternary Science*. Copies may also be obtained from the journal editor or publisher, or may be printed from this website.

Further Information. Proofs will be sent to the author for checking. This stage is to be used only to correct errors that may have been introduced during the production process. Prompt return of the corrected proofs, preferably within two days of receipt, will minimise the risk of the paper being held over to a later issue. 25 complimentary offprints will be provided to the author who checked the proofs, unless otherwise indicated. Further offprints and copies of the journal may be ordered. There is no page charge to authors.
